

# SIERRA VISTA TRANSIT PLAZA

## Overview

Located in Fort Worth, Texas, just west of the intersection of East Berry Street and South Riverside Drive, this project was highly anticipated by the surrounding community. The facility was designed to accommodate bus transfers including four passenger shelters. The project involved the redevelopment of a 0.72 acre urban site. SEC managed a team of six sub-consultants and provided civil site design including paving and sidewalks, grading and drainage, signage and markings, and utility coordination.

Adding to the complexity of this project was the fact that this area is within one of several communities that the city of Fort Worth classified as an “Urban Village.” Each “Urban Village” provides unique characteristics to its respective community. The City, The T, and SEC worked together to ensure that the development of the project coincided with the community concept.

## Scope

To ensure that the Sierra Vista Transit Plaza aligned with the Urban Village concept, SEC not only used a *Context Sensitive Approach* in the development of the site, but also coordinated with the community to ensure the design met expectations.

With a team consisting of an architect, structural engineer, landscape architect and artist, the Sierra Vista Transit Plaza includes the design:

- Bus and passenger shelters
- Paving and grading
- Sidewalks; and
- Unique, one-of-a-kind artistic enhancements that tie into the Urban Village concept
